Revisions to MARPOL Annex II and IBC Code. MARPOL Annex II and the IBC Code have revisions that will be coming into effect on January 1, 2021. U.S. flagged vessels on international voyages or that are maintaining international certificates in accordance with MARPOL Annex II or the IBC Code. These vessels must be in compliance with the new revisions before they can load NLS or IBC Chapter 17 Cargoes in 2021.

MARPOL Amendments to Annex II and the IBC Code - Entering into force on 1 January 2021 Following concerns raised about the environmental impact of permissible discharges from tankers carrying Noxious Liquid Substances (NLS), MEPC 74 in May 2019 adopted by way of IMO Resolution MEPC.315(74) , amendments to MARPOL Annex II to strengthen discharge requirements for cargo residues and tank washings from such vessels.

~~MARPOL Amendments to Annex II and the IBC Code - Entering~~

The amendment to MARPOL Annex II will include a new definition on a so-called "Persistent floater", and Regulation 13 - Control of discharges of residues of noxious liquid substances, will now require a mandatory prewash after unloading of persistent floaters when the port of unloading is located inside certain regional areas, according to new regulation 13.7.1.4 in MARPOL Annex II.

~~IBC and MARPOL Annex II changes require preparations ahead~~

This amendment to MARPOL Annex II was adopted at the 74th MEPC held on 13 -17 May 2019 and the entry into force date would be on 1st January 2021 and the areas to which the regulation will apply are the North West European waters, Baltic Sea, the West European waters and Norwegian waters.

~~Revised MARPOL Annex II regulations - Another Non-Tariff~~

With the amendments to the IBC code and MARPOL Annex II set into force from 2021, a new Certificate of Fitness (CoF) for a vessel must be issued and be onboard at the latest on 1 January 2021. Regulation 11/12/20. To remind, back in May 2019, the MEPC 74 adopted resolution MEPC.318 (74), with the main goal to amend the International Code for the Construction and Equipment of Ships Carrying Dangerous Chemicals in Bulk (IBC Code).

MARPOL Annex II Revisions - The revision of Annex II replaces the current 5-category system with pollution categories A, B, C and D and Appendix III products with a 4-category system with pollution categories X, Y and Z and OS (Other Substances). 6 MARPOL Annex II Revisions . In 2003 At MEPC 49 a 3 1 category system (X,Y,Z OS) was agreed upon.

Amendments to the IBC Code (MSC460 (101) / MEPC318 (74)), BCH Code (MSC463 (101) / MEPC319 (74)) and MARPOL 73/78 Annex II (MEPC315 (74)) will enter into force on 1 January 2021, and all ships carrying dangerous chemicals and/or noxious liquid substances in bulk need to satisfy the revised requirements prior to the date of entry into force.

Following the amendments, MEPC. 315 (74) requires the revision of P&A manuals in order to include the new requirements. As these requirements are going to come into force on 1st January 2021, the P&A Manual amendments shall be required to be actioned by all ships subject to MARPOL Annex II surveys, by the date of entry into force.

~~Annex II - Regulation 1 - MARPOL Training~~

Amendments to MARPOL Annex II (Cargo residues and tank washings of persistent floating products) enter into force on 1 January 2021. These new amendments, adopted by IMO Resolution MEPC.315 (74), have newly defined persistent floating products ("persistent floater (s)") and impose stricter prewash requirements.

~~MARPOL Annex II and the IBC Code - New requirements~~

The amendments to the IBC code and MARPOL Annex II which are expected to come into force on 1 January 2021, will affect tankers carrying chemical cargoes and other vessels carrying Noxious Liquid Substances. Specifically, the changes adopted at MEPC 74 and MSC 101 will apply from 1 January 2021, and their main changes are the following:

This present Code has been developed for the design, construction and operation of offshore support vessels (OSVs) which transport hazardous and noxious liquid substances in bulk for the servicing and resupplying of offshore platforms, mobile offshore drilling units and other offshore installations, including those employed in the search for and recovery of hydrocarbons from the seabed. The basic philosophy of the present Code is to apply standards contained in the Code and the International Code for the Construction and Equipment of Ships Carrying Dangerous Chemicals in Bulk (IBC Code) and in the International Code for the Construction and Equipment of Ships Carrying Liquefied Gases in Bulk (IGC Code) to the extent that is practicable and reasonable taking into account the unique design features and service characteristics of OSVs.

The Marine Environment Protection Committee (MEPC) of IMO, at its sixty-second session in July 2011, adopted the Revised MARPOL Annex V, concerning Regulations for the prevention of pollution by garbage from ships, which enters into force on 1 January 2013. The associated guidelines which assist States and industry in the implementation of MARPOL Annex V have been reviewed and updated and two Guidelines were adopted in March 2012 at MEPC's sixty-third session. The 2012 edition of this publication contains: the 2012 Guidelines for the implementation of MARPOL Annex V (resolution MEPC.219(63)); the 2012 Guidelines for the development of garbage management plans (resolution MEPC.220(63)); and the Revised MARPOL Annex V (resolution MEPC.201(62)).

The Condition Assessment Scheme (CAS) for oil tankers was adopted in 2001 and is applicable to all single-hull tankers of 15 years or older. Although the CAS does not specify structural standards in excess of the provisions of other IMO conventions, codes and recommendations, its requirements stipulate more stringent and transparent verification of the reported structural condition of the ship and that documentary and survey procedures have been properly carried out and completed. The Scheme requires that compliance with the CAS is assessed during the Enhanced Survey Program of Inspections concurrent with intermediate or renewal surveys currently required by resolution A.744(18), as amended.--Publisher's description.

Essential for all vessels who wish to enter an Emission Control Area, are at berth in a United Kingdom port, or a UK passenger ship operating in UK waters and controlled waters or any other passenger ship which calls at a port in the UK. The Merchant Shipping (prevention of Air Pollution from Ships) Regulation 2008, as amended, require that the master of a ship to which the regulations apply make a record to demonstrate compliance for any ship using separate fuel oils and make a record of any fuel changeover operation. The master of a ship to which the regulations apply is required to make a record: (a) in the case of a UK ship, in a log book in the format prescribed in Appendix 6 to Merchant Shipping Notice 1819 (M+F); (b) in the case of any other ship, in a ship's log book. This log book has been approved by the Maritime and Coastguard Agency for use on United Kingdom ships when recording the use of maritime fuel oil in accordance with the requirements of Annex VI of MARPOL and for ships at berth in United Kingdom ports in accordance with EU Directive 199/32/EC, as amended by Directive 2005/33/EC regarding the sulphur content of marine fuels.

This Manual provides practical information to Governments and competent (port) authorities, in particular those in developing countries, as well as the shipping industry, agencies and waste contractors seeking guidance when implementing MARPOL. It also provides guidance on how to deal with possible inadequacies, as, in order to comply fully with MARPOL, a party State has to ensure the provision of adequate port reception facilities meeting the needs of ships using their ports, without causing undue delay to the ships.

This publication presents amendments to the Code to reflect the 2007 revision of MARPOL Annex II and other amendments related to: survey and certification; materials of construction; fire protection; personnel protection; certificate of fitness for the carriage of dangerous chemicals in bulk
